

## Notice to Public

As an Entitlement Community the City of Sumter expects to receive approximately \$101,433.00 from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development for fiscal year 4/1/08-3/31/09, based on the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009. The city is required to amend last year Annual Action Plan to identify the activities it will undertake due to the Amendment required for the additional allocation of funds to city by the ARRA of 2009. Persons wishing to make comments on the proposed amendment to the plan may do so in writing or by visiting the Community Development office. Additionally the amendment will be posted on the City of Sumter website at <http://www.sumtersc.gov>. The review period runs from May 28 to June 3, 2009.
